### **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FOR ROMANS 12:1**

1. As you reflect on the sermon and the Scripture we just heard, what was the main point of the first few phrases in Romans 12:1? What stood out to you? What is something you learned? What is something that you still have questions about?
2. Partner up with another person and in 60 seconds share with them the gospel. Then give your partner 60 seconds to share the gospel with you.
  - a. (After this activity, you may want to walk through the 4 main components of the gospel – God, man, Christ, response – making sure that all 4 were covered in some way in the presentations that were shared among partners.)
3. Why is it important for us to clearly understand the gospel?
4. What, if anything, is unclear to you about the gospel?
5. How often do you share the gospel? If it's not very often, why do you think you are not sharing the gospel more frequently?
6. Who is someone you know whose life was completely transformed by the gospel? What is different about them?
7. With regard to the previous question, do you think anyone would give your name as an example of someone who has been and is being transformed by the gospel? Why or why not?
8. Why does it seem that Christians can sometimes “get over” the gospel so easily? Why should we not do so?
9. In what ways could considering what God has done for us in Jesus, make a difference each day? How can we be intentional about considering the gospel on a daily basis?
10. Why is it important to understand that every Kingdom responsibility God gives to us also comes with all of His Kingdom resources – namely, His daily mercies?
11. Why do you think we often try to live the Christian life without relying on God's daily mercies? How successful has this path been for you?
12. In what ways, is the gospel changing how you relate to God?
13. In what ways, is the gospel changing how you relate to other believers?
14. In what ways, is the gospel changing how you relate to non-Christians?
15. How much of Romans 12:3-13 do you think is currently reflected at Hebron?
16. How can we pray for one another this week?
