DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FOR ROMANS 12:13

1. What, if anything, from the text or the sermon did God use to speak to you today?
2. What, if any, questions came to your mind during the sermon or from studying the text?
3. In what ways do you think God's call for Christians to be intentionally involved in the lives of other believers makes Christianity special?
4. What would you say to someone you're discipling who only wants to attend a worship service, but does not desire to connect with or serve other Christians?
5. When was a time that other Christians met a need in your life or a need your family had? How did God use that in your life or the lives of others? How did God use that for the sake of the gospel?
6. Why is counting the needs of others as more important than our own so difficult? How can we grow in considering the needs of other believers above our own?
7. What are specific needs that you think believers can meet for each other?
8. When was a time you had an opportunity to contribute to the need of another believer, but you chose not to do so? What would you do differently now if you could?
9. What makes us hesitant to meet needs that others have?
10. We all need help at different times, so what makes us hesitant to receive ministry from other believers?
11. Are there needs that you or your family have that you are not sharing with your Connect Group? If so, why not?
12. Who is someone you know or have known who clearly demonstrated a gift of hospitality? How has someone blessed you with their hospitality?
13. What is a difference between entertaining and being hospitable?
14. What are ways you and your family are seeking (being intentional) to be hospitable toward other believers? How are you seeking to be hospitable toward non-believers?
15. What, if anything, is keeping you from being more hospitable?
16. If you were to make a list of the names of your neighbors, how many families could you list? How many of them have you had in your home?
