5. When you think over your life, would you say you've experienced more trials/suffering because of your obedience or disobedience?
6. If we take the gospel to our neighbors and the nations, why should we expect persecution? Why, then, are we still so surprised by it?
7. Who is someone you know that has experienced persecution for Christ's sake? How did God use that in their life and the life of others?
8. Why is it so important to plan and pray that our reaction to persecution will reflect Christ's character? Why does it not just happen naturally?
9. When, if ever, was a time you experienced persecution of any kind for Christ's sake and you reacted just as Romans 12:12 describes? When, if ever, was a time your reaction did not reflect Christ's character?
10. Is there anyone currently in your life whom you do not want to bless? What should you do if this is true?
11. How often do you consider Kingdom rewards? Why should we consider them more often?
12. What do you need to pray about, change, or do in light of Romans 12:12?
