LOVING ACCOUNTABILITY

As we partnered with God this past week to _____, what did He do? How did He work in and through us?

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FOR 1 Corinthians 15:35-57

1. As a faith family, we've been praying for our "one" whom we long to see come to Christ. How's it going with your "one"? Have you been able to have any gospel conversations with him or her? How can we join you in praying for them?
2. Prior to our study in 1 Corinthians 15, when is a time before that you participated in an in-depth study of the resurrection? What, if any, resources were helpful for you?
3. Have you ever had an Easter season where you put more thought into decorations, baskets, outfits and egg hunts than truly considering Christ's substitutionary atonement and resurrection? How can we make sure that Walmart doesn't give more thought to Easter than we do?
4. Read Ephesians 1:19-21. When Paul wants the church at Ephesus to understand how powerful God is, what example does He give them to consider?
5. How can understanding the power God has, like when He raised Christ from the dead and seated Him above every rule, authority, and power, be helpful for us in our sanctification? Why do you think Paul wants the Ephesians to understand this important truth?
6. With today's text, in what way, if any, did the Spirit speak to you directly through 1 Corinthians 15:35-57 or one of the supporting verses? Did He encourage you in some way or convict you in some way? If so, how?
7. When you've thought about what our bodies will be like in Heaven, what has come to your mind? Why is it important to let the Word inform all of these thoughts?
8. Why do we need to put on the "imperishable" in order to dwell in God's presence forever?
9. How can the illustrations Paul uses in 1 Corinthians 15:35-41 help us know that we will be changed but will still be able to be recognized in Heaven?
10. In what ways is Christ superior to Adam in 1 Corinthians 15:45-49?
11. Read 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18. How often do you think about this moment? What excites you about it? Does anything cause you fear? Why do you think Paul tells us to encourage each other with these words?
12. Why are Christians the only ones who will be able to ask "O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting?"
13. How should we express our thanks to God for the victory He's given to us through our Lord Jesus Christ (v. 57)?
