LOVING ACCOUNTABILITY

As we partnered with God this past week to ______, what did He do? How did He work in and through us?

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FOR PSALM 8:1-9

- 1. In what way did God use His Spirit and His Word in your heart and mind as we studied Psalm 8?
- 2. What is David's view of God? What are specific truths that David writes about God? How much time do we devote to the greatness of God?
- 3. How does Psalm 8 begin and end? What is significant about God's name that reminds us that He is worthy of our praise and worship?
- 4. What causes you to worship God? Why?
- 5. David worships God because of His creation. Are we tempted to worship creation instead of worshipping God? Why?
- 6. How often do you think about your own name (character/reputation) instead of God's name? Why are we prone to think of ourselves before/instead of God?
- 7. How does knowing that God is Lord, or the one in control, change your attitude when you worship? If God is Lord, what does that mean for you?
- 8. What does Psalm 8 and 1 Corinthians 1:27 reveal to us about God's plan? Why do you think that God reminds His people of the truths contained in these verses?
- 9. How does it make you feel knowing that God is mindful of you and cares for you? How important is it to remember that God knows and cares for you? Is there someone in your life that needs to be reminded that God cares for them?
- 10. Read Genesis 1:26-27. What was unique about the creation of man that is different than any other thing God created?
- 11. How does God's mindfulness and care for humanity inform your attitude towards other people?
- 12. What do Genesis 1:26-27 and Psalm 8 teach us about stewardship? Why is stewardship such a big deal? What is one place in your life (money, time, talents, etc.) that you can be a better steward?
- 13. What effect does this passage have on your understanding of purpose? What does it look like to see God's purpose for you in your work?
- 14. By quoting Psalm 8, what do Hebrews 2:5-9 and 1 Corinthians 15:26-28 teach us about the supremacy of Christ?
- 15. What is one thing you need to do or believe in the Spirit's power this week to live out from Psalm 8?
