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## **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FOR REV. 2:12-17**

- 1. In what way, if any, did the Lord speak to you today through His Spirit and His Word?
- 2. Where do you think are some of the most difficult places to serve Christ in our world? Where do you think are some of the most difficult places to serve Christ in Dacula?
- 3. Where is it most difficult for you to serve Christ?
- 4. In what situations have you been most tempted to compromise some aspect of God's Word in order to "fit in" with culture or family or co-workers or friends?
- 5. How do you think the believers in Pergamum were able to remain faithful to Christ's name and the faith despite their brother, Antipas, being martyred? What role do you think suffering played in their sanctification?
- 6. What responsibilities do you believe we have for other Christians in our faith family? How do you feel you are doing in carrying out those responsibilities?
- 7. Have you ever been in a situation where you knew another member of your church held beliefs contradictory to God's Word? What, if anything, did you do with that information?
- 8. If we know someone in our faith family holds convictions that are in conflict with God's Word, why is it unloving to Jesus and to them for us to do nothing about it? How can we come alongside them?
- 9. Why do some of us so often try to find satisfaction in disobedience rather than obedience to God's Word?
- 10. How can we make sure our "discipling" is not just "do's and don't's" from God's Word, but above all, modeling what delighting in God looks like and the joy and satisfaction that come from walking in His ways?
- 11. What is the relationship between the sword mentioned in Revelation 2:16 and the sword mentioned in Hebrews 4:12?
- 12. For those who choose to reject God and His Word, how can we warn them of the conflict that is coming for them with Christ if they do not repent?
- 13. When is the last time you called someone to repent so they could be restored by Christ rather than ruined by Him? What keeps you from doing this more and more?
