DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FOR REVELATION 7:1-17

- 1. In what way(s) did God use His Spirit and Rev. 7:1-17 to speak to you today?
- 2. How can we handle "difficult" passages like Revelation 7 without letting them unnecessarily divide us?
- 3. In what ways can we see that Revelation 7 was provided to fuel worship instead of worry in our hearts?
- 4. In studying Revelation 7, why should more of the focus be on 7:9-17 than 7:1-8?
- 5. No matter who we understand those who are sealed in Rev. 7:1-8 to be, what do these verses teach us most importantly about God?
- 6. In Revelation 6:16-17, the great day of wrath of the One seated on the throne and of the Lamb has come and the question is asked, "Who can stand?" In what way is this question answered in Rev. 7:9? How are they enabled to stand before the throne and the Lamb?
- 7. What does it mean for robes to be washed and made white "in the blood of the Lamb?"
- 8. Why should knowing that people from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages will one day stand before the Lord fuel our passion for the Lord to advance His gospel in us and through us?
- 9. As you read Rev. 7:15-17, which promises for those who are sealed stand out to you?
- 10. What should we think as we see those in Rev. 6:16 who want to be sheltered from the presence of the One who sits on the throne versus those in Rev. 7:15 who are sheltered by His presence?
- 11. Why should we never take for granted phrases like "He...will shelter them with His presence" and "the Lamb...will be their shepherd?"
- 12. For believers, why should our secure position in Christ lead us to steadfast perseverance and even risking much for the gospel?
