- 8. In what ways should the prayer of the martyrs fuel our persevering in prayer?
- 9. When was a time that God answered a prayer you were praying in His right time instead of yours?
- 10. What would you say to someone who thinks their pleas for the Lord to carry out His holy justice are not being heard?
- 11. What are some ways that creation with testify that Jesus is coming again?
- 12. Based on Rev. 6:15-17, how can we know that no one outside of Christ will be spared and that nowhere outside of Christ will be safe?
