DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FOR MARK 1:1-20

1. In what way did God use His Spirit and His Word in your life today?
2. Why are you choosing to participate in a Connect Group this semester? Why do you think Connect Groups are important?
3. In what ways do you hope God uses this Connect Group in your life and uses you in their lives?
4. As we start our study of Mark, why do we often say that “nothing is better for God’s people than God’s Word?” What do we mean by this? Do you believe this?
5. When are some previous times that you’ve studied the book of Mark? What do you remember from that study? What, if anything, changed about how you live because of what you learned in Mark?
6. Why is it important to understand the gospel is foremost an announcement of what God has accomplished for us in Jesus, and not a call for our action or accomplishments?
7. Why is it important in Mark 1 to not just see the trees (John’s ministry, Jesus’ baptism, Jesus’ temptation, Jesus’ preaching), but the forest (what all these things combined are saying about Jesus being the Christ, the Son of God)?
8. Why is “Who do you say that I am” the most important question we can answer about Jesus?
9. How would you describe your obedience to Jesus’ words, “Follow Me?”
10. If we are convinced that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, how should this impact our daily lives?
11. What can you praise God for in Mark 1? What truths in Mark 1 can fuel our worship of God?
12. What truths in Mark 1 would be good for you to share with someone else this week?
