#### **LOVING ACCOUNTABILITY**

#### **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FOR EPHESIANS 2:11-22**

1. In what way(s) did God speak to you today through His Spirit and His Word?
2. Why is it significant that in the first three chapters of his letter to the church at Ephesus, Paul's only command is for them to "remember"? What is it that Paul wants them (and us) to remember?
3. Why do we need to be commanded to remember? What can we do to help remember what Paul is calling us to always consider?
4. Why is it important that we remember what it's like, without Christ, to be strangers and aliens who have no right to God or His Kingdom?
5. What are the implications of Christ's breaking down the dividing wall of hostility between us and God? What did it require for this to be accomplished?
6. Why does it seem some Christians can be really skilled in building new walls of hostility between them and other Christians?
7. What does it mean for Christ to be the cornerstone of "the whole structure"?
8. Why is important when thinking of "church" that we know and believe we've been joined together and are being built together with other Christians?
9. What does it mean to be "a holy temple in the Lord" or "a dwelling place for God?"
10. Read Ephesians 2:18 again. How can this verse be used to fuel both awe and action in our lives?
