## **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FOR TITUS 2:1-6**

- 1. In what way(s) did God speak to you today through His Spirit and His Word?
- 2. Who is someone that has helped you grow in Christ? How did that mentorship begin?
- 3. Why does becoming a godly man or woman happen intentionally and not accidentally?
- 4. Why is it significant that Paul tells the mature men and women to train the younger men and women and not just Titus to do all the training?
- 5. Why do you think Paul mentions sound doctrine so many times in his letter to Titus (1:9, 13; 2:1, 8, 10)? Is sound doctrine any less important in our day?
- 6. Why does Paul connect sound doctrine with how older men and women and younger men and women in the church should be living and relating to one another?
- 7. Why are these relationships crucial for the Word of God not being reviled (2:5)? Is there any way our lives could be fuel for the reviling of God or His Word?
- 8. What stands out to you about the list of characteristics in either the older men and women or the younger men and women?
- 9. What gospel relationships are you intentionally pursuing at Hebron?
- 10. What, if anything, is holding you back from both mentoring someone else and being mentored by another person?
- 11. Why is God's grace so important for Titus 2 and our ability to obey this text?
