### DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FOR PROVERBS 1

1. In what way(s), did the Spirit use His Word in your heart and mind as we studied Proverbs today? In what ways were you convicted, encouraged, or equipped?
2. Why should we study every book in the Bible? In what ways are you intentionally pursuing this discipline? How is Bible study different from Bible reading?
3. How familiar are you with the book of Proverbs? How often have you studied Proverbs?
4. Who is someone who taught you the way of godly wisdom or led you in the path of uprightness? Whom are you leading in these same ways?
5. When you see the phrase “fear of the Lord,” whom or what comes to your mind?
6. How would you explain “fearing the Lord” to someone you are discipling?
7. Read Proverbs 14:26. How and why should we strive to live this verse?
8. Why do you think the Lord made the parents the primary teachers of their children rather than the priests?
9. In what way, are you demonstrating the importance of formative instruction to those entrusted to your care or those you are discipling?
10. What should we do if we do not want to hear our father’s instruction or if we want to forsake our mother’s teaching?
11. Both wisdom and folly call to us. According to Proverbs 1:20-33, why should we embrace wisdom?
12. In what ways do you think God uses Proverbs to ultimately point to the wisdom that is in Christ? How can we remember that wisdom is not just a philosophy but a Person?
13. In what ways are you hoping our study of Proverbs benefits our congregation and our community?
14. By the Lord’s Spirit and grace, what action steps do you need to take after studying Proverbs 1?
