8. How does Christ break sin and death's yoke, staff, and rod of oppression?
9. How is both the humanity and deity of Christ prophesied in 9:6?
10. What comfort does it give you to know our King is a Wonderful Counselor, the Mighty God, an Everlasting Father, and the Prince of Peace? What joy do you take in being ruled by One so awesome?
11. How can we take hope in knowing Christ will always reign with justice and righteousness?
12. How can Christ's reigning on the throne of David give us good confidence in all the promises God has made?
13. What's one gospel goal you have for this Christmas season?
