### SERMON-BASED CURRICULUM

#### LOVING ACCOUNTABILITY

#### DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FOR HEBREWS 12:4-17

1. In what way(s) did God speak to you today through His Spirit and His Word?
2. Why is holiness required for us to see God? From whom does this holiness come?
3. In what ways is God's discipline for the good of our faith, holiness, and perseverance? Why don't we always see God's discipline as good?
4. Even if God's discipline is not comfortable, why can we take comfort in it?
5. When is a time that God disciplined you (either formatively or correctively) and it was for your good?
6. What is an example of when the Holy Spirit used God's formative discipline (training in His Word) in your life to help you run in obedience rather than choose disobedience?
7. How are you striving for peace with everyone? If there is someone for whom striving for peace with them is difficult, how can the Lord help you?
8. How are you striving for holiness? What does this look like on a daily/weekly basis?
9. How do you think you are reflecting God's holiness currently in your life?
10. Who are you helping grow in God's grace? Who are you helping to run the race of sanctification and how are you helping them?
11. How can a root of bitterness toward God and the gospel quickly work its way through a faith family? How can we strive to not allow roots of bitterness to grow in ourselves or in others?
12. How can we help each other avoid sexual immorality? Why do we need each other's help in this matter?
13. Is there any way you've been "regarding lightly the discipline of the Lord" or even flat out rejecting it? Why should we be quick to repent and seek reconciliation with the Lord?
