#### LOVING ACCOUNTABILITY

1. As you consider this past week, for what are you praising or thanking God?

4. When you've experienced trials before, have you found those who were encouraging you to keep praising God to be annoying, hurtful, helpful, or something else?
5. When you've experienced difficulties in the past, what passages of Scripture have been particularly helpful for you?
6. In the midst of suffering, how can we have a God-centered perspective more than self-centered pity?
7. What comes to your mind when you hear the phrase, "God caused us to be born again?" Why do we need regeneration?
8. How does knowing God sustain our faith by His great power encourage you?
9. Who do you know that currently does not have the living hope that comes through Jesus? How can we join you in praying for them?
10. When are times that you can specifically remember rejoicing in God? When are times that you remember taking particular joy in your salvation?
11. What is the biblical perspective we should have about our trials? What do we allow at times to keep us from having this biblical perspective?
12. What are some trials God has used in your journey in order to refine your faith?
13. Of the markers Peter provides for genuine faith (loving Christ, believing Christ, rejoicing in Christ with inexpressible joy), which is most evident in you and which is least evident?
14. Peter says this salvation was announced to his readers through the good news that was preached to them. Who shared the gospel with you when you received Christ?
