DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FOR ACTS 3:1-26

- 1. In what way(s) did God speak to you today through His Spirit and His Word?
- 2. When was a time you needed help and others stopped, cared, and helped you?
- 3. When was a time someone was asking for help, but you didn't help? What kept you from helping?
- 4. What do you think it would have been like to see this man walking and jumping into the temple and yelling praises to God? When have you ever wanted to do the same thing?
- 5. What can we learn about God's power from the healing of this man?
- 6. Why is the message Peter proclaimed even more important than the miracle that was performed?
- 7. Why is it important that Peter emphasized all glory should go to Christ and not the apostles' power or piety? How do you think it could have been tempting for Peter to want at least a little credit?
- 8. As we study the sermon Peter proclaimed in the Spirit's power, what can we learn about Christ?
- 9. What can we also learn from Peter's sermon to the crowd about how we can be faithful witnesses of Christ? How and what does he communicate that we also need to communicate when sharing the Gospel?
- 10. Why is it important that we not just relay the message of the Gospel, but we also call people to repentance from sin and to refreshing in the Savior?
- 11. Why do we not just need forgiveness but also righteousness?
- 12. How should we react to certain hope of having our sins blotted out by Christ?
- 13. How can we keep being amazed that God would want to bless us by helping us turn from our wickedness and by sending His Son to us? Why should this truth always be amazing to us?
- 14. Who needs you to care about them and give them time this week?
- 15. Who needs to hear about Jesus from you this week?
