



Discussion Questions for Genesis 14

1. In what way(s) did God speak to you today through His Spirit and His Word?
2. What decisions are you trying to make right now? In what ways are you seeking the Lord for direction in those decisions?
3. Give an example of when you have done the right thing, even when it was difficult? How do you counsel others to do the right thing when they are faced with difficult decisions?
4. How do we help other people or even ourselves realize that the right thing may not always be the easy thing?
5. How has God used your faithfulness for the good of someone else? How has God used the faithfulness of someone else for your good? Take time to share with each other and thank God for using the faithfulness of His people in the lives of others.
6. What does it look like to be your “brother’s keeper” in our faith family? How have you seen this played out in the life of our church?
7. What does this passage teach us about reconciliation?
8. Why does the writer of Genesis give us contrasting pictures of different people? (Cain and Seth; Lot and Abram; King of Sodom, and King of Salem) What can we learn from these contrasting figures?
9. What can we learn about Melchizedek from this passage of Scripture and from other passages of the Scripture? (Psalm 110; Hebrews 5:9-10; 7:1-10, 7:13-25)
10. What does it look like to respond to the Lord with thankfulness and generosity?
11. How does Abram’s actions show trust in the Lord? Would those closest to you say that your actions show trust in the Lord?
12. What are ways you see the text pointing us to Christ?
